Hunts Point Interstate Access Improvement Contracts 1-3

The Hunts Point Interstate Access Improvement Project is a \$1.7B, three phase NYSDOT project to improve access between the Hunts Point Peninsula and the Sheridan and Bruckner Expressways for vehicular traffic and to address structural and operations deficiencies related to the existing infrastructure. The Hunts Point Peninsula is home to a 329-acre food distribution center that serves 23 million customers, accounting for approximately 60% of food distribution in the area in the greater New York metropolitan area. Most of the food is delivered by truck through the local system of highways, most notably, the Bruckner Expressway. 78,000 vehicles travel to and from the peninsula daily, including over 13,000 trucks. The project includes 12 bridges and viaduct structures and the site covers more than 1.5 miles of existing infrastructure including highways, expressways, services roads and city streets, parkland, pedestrian bridges, and local intersection improvements to meet ADA requirements.

This site tour will cover features of all three contracts, highlighting critical tie in points between the three contracts, and some of the newly constructed areas including the new flyover ramp from Edgewater Road to Sheridan Blvd, the newly replaced Bruckner Bridges over Amtrak/CSX and the newly constructed Garrison Park.
